Farmer leaders in animal care, antibiotic stewardship, sustainability and workforce best practices, along with a top FARM Program evaluator, were recognized at the fourth annual FARM Excellence Awards presentation held at National Milk Producers Federation's annual meeting.

Winners were announced October 22 during the Awards Luncheon at the 2024 Joint Annual Meeting of the National Milk Producers Federation (NMPF), National Dairy Promotion and Research Board (NDB), and United Dairy Industry Association (UDIA) in Phoenix, Arizona.

The awards recognized three farms and one evaluator who go above and beyond industry standards and best management practices through their commitment to innovation and continuous improvement. The 2024 FARM Excellence Award recipients are:

Veterinarians Challenge the Norm at Annual Conference

The American Association of Bovine Practitioners held its annual conference, "Challenging the Norm", Sept. 12-14 in Columbus, OH. The three-day event, with over 1500 attendees demonstrated the industry's commitment to best practices for cattle care and teaching the next generation of dairy and beef veterinarians. The conference included continuing education on beef, dairy, welfare topics, practice management, student/new graduate topics, practice tips and other sessions, plus preconference seminars and clinical forums.

FARM Environmental Stewardship Version 3 Set to Launch Oct. 31

FARM Environmental Stewardship Version 3 launches Oct. 31. Version 3 updates include the implementation of the Ruminant Farm System model, a whole-farm model that simulates dairy farm production and environmental impact. FARM ES Version 3 gives dairy farmers a scientifically robust tool with more advanced features to assess the impact of potential practice or technology changes.

Dr. Jamie Jonker, NMPF's chief science officer and International Dairy Federation's science program coordinating committee chair, highlighted industry efforts in the newest edition of the IDF Animal Health Report.

ICYMI: H5N1 Biosecurity and Management Strategies for Dairy Farms

The FARM Program partnered with Uplevel Podcast's Peggy Coffeen for a conversation with dairy farmers and experts on H5N1 during World Dairy Expo in Madison, WI earlier this month.

Hear insights from Dr. Jason Lombard of Colorado State University and Dr. Keith Poulson of the Wisconsin Veterinary Diagnostic Lab on the ongoing outbreak. Miquela Hanselman, who leads the FARM Program's biosecurity efforts shares biosecurity steps producers can take to mitigate transmission risk and Michigan dairy farmer Brent Wilson reflects on how H5N1 affected his herd, and the lessons learned. Primary managers and evaluators will receive an email with specific details on how to navigate Version 3 evaluations on launch day. This notice will also include a toolkit with resources on how to share information on FARM ES Version 3.

Answers to 2024 Cattle Traceability Rule Available

The National Cattlemen's Beef Association created an FAQ for producers about USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service's regulation regarding animal disease traceability for interstate movements. This informational document outlines requirements, implementation dates and other key information to ensure compliance with the rule.

DATABASE UPDATES

October Database Updates

The National Dairy FARM Program Database was updated Oct. 15 to include general improvements, new features and bug fixes.

Major Updates:

- Action Plan Date Selection Restriction: The date field in the Action Plan Follow-up/Resolution overlay has been restricted, preventing users from selecting a date before the action's generated date. This fix resolves negative time calculation issues in the resolution time reports.
- Evaluation Sync Across Devices: Resolved an issue where evaluations started on one device (e.g., mobile) were not visible on other devices (e.g., desktop). The app now automatically syncs with the server upon login, ensuring that evaluations

are updated and accessible across all devices without needing to clear browsing data.

ACv5/ESv3 Error Display: Resolved an issue where validation errors in the
evaluation app were being displayed twice with slightly different messages. Now,
validation errors will only display once, streamlining error communication for
users.
